

News and Homework for week beginning 19th March



This week in Maths... We continued our topics of time, ratio and proportion. In time, we have learnt how to tell the time using a digital clock and a clock with Roman numerals and how these compare to an ordinary analogue clock, whilst for proportion we learned how to identify whether a shape is similar and practised using scale factors to enlarge and reduce 2D and 3D shapes.

In English...We began the week by studying our model text (which showcased all the skills Mrs. Smith is looking for!) and retold them using a text map. Next, we practised our skill at giving and following verbal instructions, evaluating the language we used and what helped us in particular. Finally, we planned, wrote, edited and published our own set of instructions on how to look after a pet mythical creature.









In other news... For Sports Relief this week, we have started each day with a 'Wake and Shake' dance activity in the hall. It's been lots of fun! On Monday in topic, we re-enacted the trial of King Charles I; owls played the roles of the judge, Oliver Cromwell, Charles I, court guards and members of parliament. In Science, we explored magnetic poles, how they attract and repel each other, and created our own magnetic compasses which we used to locate 'treasure' in the playground. Finally, in DT, we completed our fairground rides by painting and decorating our structures before testing their rotational movement. They look amazing – well done Owls!
