Science

EYFS:

Children know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things. They talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how environments might vary from one another. They make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.

KS1/2:

Animals including Humans

- Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals
- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals
- Identify, name, draw and label finer body parts, e.g. wrist, chin, ankle, waist, shoulder, hips, etc.
- Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults
- Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)
- Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene

Maths

EYFS: Doubling, Halving, Addition and Subtraction, Shape and Measurement.

KS1/2

- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.
- Add and subtract one digit and two digit numbers to 20, including 0.
- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+) subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
- Solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems.
- Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.
- Solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.
- Use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure capacity (l/ml) and temperature (oC) to the nearest appropriate unit, using thermometers and measuring vessels.
- Compare and order volume/capacity & record the results using >, < and =.

History and Geography

- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries of the United Kingdom.
- Name the capital cities of the United Kingdom and the surrounding seas.
- Make comparisons of human and physical features of a small area of the United Kingdom with my locality (e.g. a city location and a village location).
