- to improve pupil performance in competitive sport at local level.

#### Impact of PE and Sports Grant



The PE and Sports funding has contributed to the provision of high quality PE at Creaton School with a much wider range of PE experiences being offered. Some staff have been upskilled in the delivery of PE lessons. The school now has a dedicated member of staff to co-ordinate the sporting events across the Federation. The lunch-time activity club has improved pupils' engagement in structured physical activity. The introduction of pupil Sports Crew Leaders has been met with enthusiasm. Children enthusiastically participate in cluster sporting competitions and events. This has had an impact on levels of self-confidence and self-esteem, which in turn contributes to improving levels of achievement across the curriculum. The school has achieved its Sainsbury's Bronze Sports Award.
